

# **FLIGHT 18 (MILE HIGH), ORDER OF DAEDALIANS BY-LAWS**

## **ARTICLE I. CHARTER**

A. Per charter granted by the NATIONAL ORDER OF DAEDALIANS, properly executed and dated July 4, 1965, FLIGHT 18 (MILE HIGH), Order of Daedalians is established in Denver, Colorado. It is incorporated as a NOT FOR PROFIT organization under the laws pertaining thereto of the State of Colorado.

## **ARTICLE II. TENETS AND OBJECTIVES**

A. The tenets:

First: TO PLACE NATION ABOVE SELF (PATRIOTISM)

Second: TO BE WORTHY OF THE TRUST AND CONFIDENCE OF FELLOW DAEDALIANS (PERSONAL INTEGRITY AND CHARACTER).

B. The Objectives:

(1) THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF MILITARY AEROSPACE ACTIVITIES TO ENSURE THAT THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA MAINTAINS ITS FREEDOM AND STATUS AMONG NATIONS OF THE WORLD.

(2) THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF YOUNG PEOPLE WHO RECEIVE VALUABLE AEROSPACE TRAINING TO MAKE THE MILITARY THEIR CAREER.

(3) THE ENCOURAGEMENT AND SUPPORT OF ACTIVITIES THAT WILL IMPROVE METHODS OF FLIGHT AND FLIGHT SAFETY.

(4) THE ENCOURAGEMENT AND STIMULATION OF THE YOUNGER GENERATION IN DEVELOPING THOSE ATTRIBUTES THAT ARE THE BASIS OF THE TENETS OF THE ORDER.

(5) ASSISTANCE IN THE EDUCATION OF DESERVING PERSONS IN THE FIELDS OF AEROSPACE ENGINEERING AND FLIGHT.

(6) AN INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP OF THE ORDER (TO NEAR THE MAXIMUM OF THOSE ELIGIBLE) SO THAT THE WEIGHT OF ITS MEMBERSHIP AND THE PRESTIGE OF THE ORDER WILL ENSURE PERPETUITY AND AUGMENT THE CAPABILITIES OF THE ORDER TO EFFECT ITS OBJECTIVES.

## **ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP**

A. Definition of Founder Member (for historical reference). A person who, prior to November 12, 1918, as a commissioned officer in any component of the United States Armed Services, held a rating as pilot of heavier-than-air aircraft. Founder members were the first to fly airplanes in time of war. Due to the ravages of time, there are no living Founder Members.

B. The membership of FLIGHT 18 (MILE HIGH) shall consist only of those having membership in the National Order of Daedalians which consists of the following:

Named Members

Hereditary Members

Honorary Members

C. Named Member. A military pilot, of heavier-than-air powered aircraft in any component of the United States Armed Forces, who is or has been a commissioned or warrant/flight officer or WASP and who is accepted as a member to perpetuate the membership of a founder Member. Only two Named Members are authorized for any one Founder Member.
